Mission and Vision

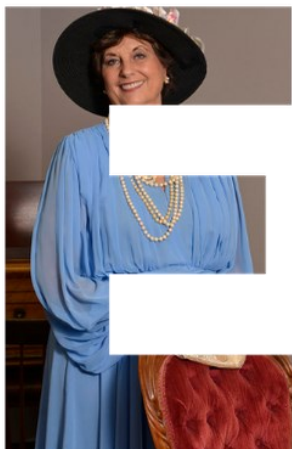

- Initiation of phase I of the Historic Structures Report

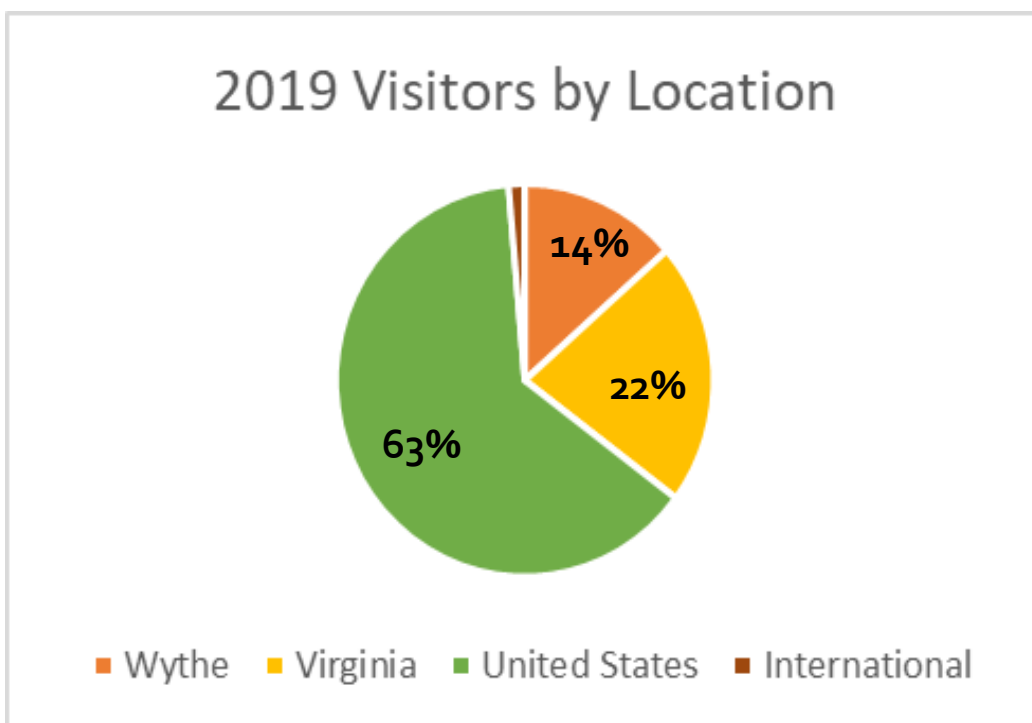
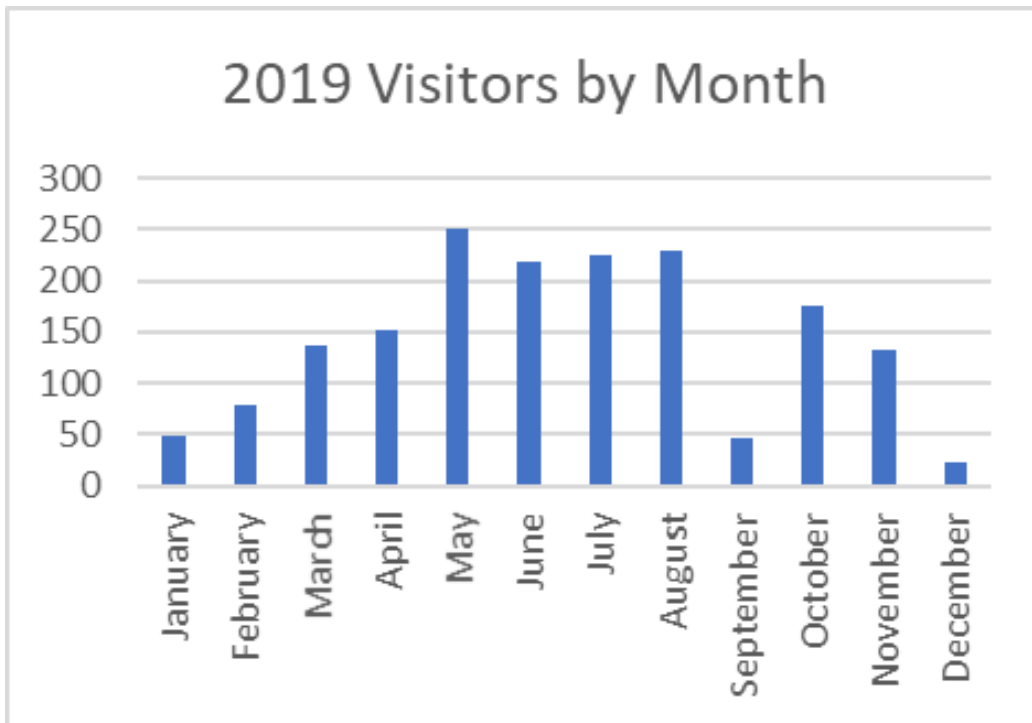

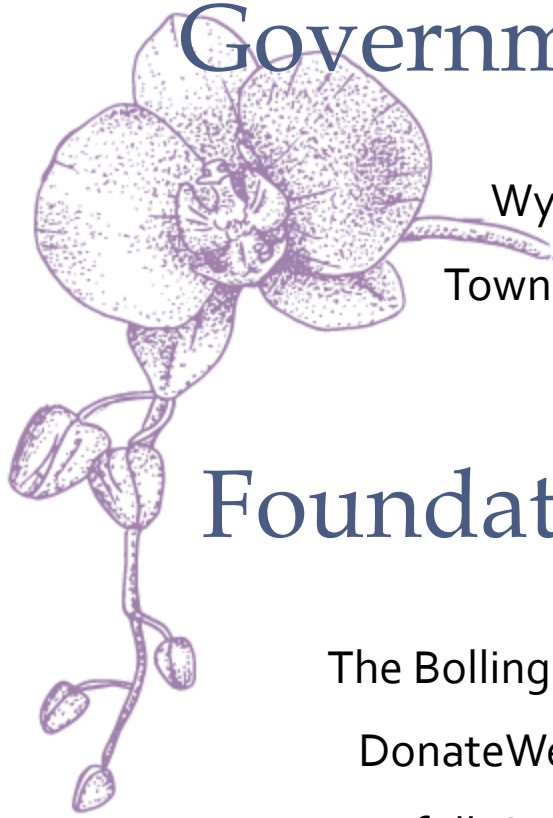
